1. The County Board, having considered the following factors, hereby finds that the following rezoning is in the best interests of the citizens of Richland County:

- (a) Adequate public facilities to serve the development are present or will be provided.
- (b) Provision of these facilities will not be an unreasonable burden to local government.
- (c) The land to be rezoned is suitable for development and development will not cause unreasonable water or air pollution, soil erosion or adverse effects on rare or irreplaceable natural areas.
- (d) Non-farm development will be directed to non-agricultural soils or less productive soils.
- (e) Non-farm development will be directed to areas where it will cause minimum disruption of established farm operations or damage to environmentally sensitive areas.
- (f) Non-farm development will be encouraged to locate so as to leave a maximum amount of farmland in farmable size parcels.
- (g) Non-farm residential development will be directed to existing platted subdivisions and sanitary districts.

RESOLUTION NO. 15 - 115

A Resolution Adopting A Policy Prohibiting The Use Of Excessive Force Against Non-Violent Civil Rights Demonstrators.

WHEREAS Congress recently enacted Federal law known as the Armstrong-Walker Excess Force Amendment which prohibits the use of excessive force by local law enforcement agencies against individuals engaged in non-violent civil rights demonstrations within the agency's jurisdiction, and WHEREAS the County is applying for and may receive an Energy Efficiency and Conversation Block Grant of Federal funds through the Wisconsin Department of Commerce and the County will be required to comply with the Armstrong-Walker Amendment as a condition of receiving this grant, and

WHEREAS the County needs to adopt a formal policy against the use of excessive force by law enforcement against demonstrators in order to retain its eligibility for the Wisconsin Department of Commerce Grant and its eligibility for future Federal grants and the Law Enforcement and Judiciary Committee has carefully considered this matter and is now presenting this Resolution to the County Board for its consideration.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Richland County Board of Supervisors that Richland County hereby adopts the following policies:

1. Excessive force shall not be used by the Richland County Sheriff's Department against individuals engaged in lawful, non-violent civil rights demonstrations within County boundaries;

2. The County Board hereby adopts the Sheriff's Department's Policy and Procedure for Use of Force, a copy of which is on file in the Sheriff's Department. This policy prohibits the use of excessive force in all situations involving civil demonstrations and this policy also follows the Wisconsin Law Enforcement Center Board's policies on the use of force;

3. Any State and local laws against physically barring entrance to or exit from a facility or location that is the subject of such non-violent civil rights demonstrations within the County will be enforced by the Sheriff's Department, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its passage and publication.
