Amendment # 409 To Richland County Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance No. 5 Relating To The Rick Schoenemann Parcel In The Town Of Buena Vista.

The Richland County Board of Supervisors does hereby ordain as follows:

1. The County Board, having considered the following factors, hereby finds that the following rezoning is in the best interests of the citizens of Richland County:

- (a) Adequate public facilities to serve the development are present or will be provided.
- (b) Provision of these facilities will not be an unreasonable burden to local government.
- (c) The land to be rezoned is suitable for development and development will not cause unreasonable water or air pollution, soil erosion or adverse effects on rare or irreplaceable natural areas.
- (d) Non-farm development will be directed to non-agricultural soils or less productive soils.
- (e) Non-farm development will be directed to areas where it will cause minimum disruption of established farm operations or damage to environmentally sensitive areas.
- (f) Non-farm development will be encouraged to locate so as to leave a maximum amount of farmland in farmable size parcels.
- (g) Non-farm residential development will be directed to existing platted subdivisions and sanitary districts.

That the official maps designating district boundaries, as adopted by Richland County Ordinance 1985 No. 1 (also known as Amendment No. 1 to the Richland County Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance No. 3), which was adopted on March 19, 1985, are hereby amended as follows:

That the following-described 7.90 acre parcel belonging to Rick Schoeneman in the Town of Buena Vista is hereby rezoned from the General Agricultural and Forestry District to the Agricultural and Residential District:

A parcel located in part of the SW ¼ of the NE ¼ and the NW ¼ of the SE ¼ of Section 26, T9N, R2E, Town of Buena Vista, Richland County, Wisconsin, being more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the North ¼ Corner of said Section 26; thence S 00°20'24" W along the West line of the NE ¼, 2450.48 feet; thence N 57°51'42" E, 991.28 feet to the centerline of State Trunk Highway "130" and to the point of beginning.

Zoning Administrator Bindl reported that there were no rezoning petitions being recommended for denial by the Zoning and Land Information Committee.

WHEREAS the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (DOT) has established the Wisconsin Bicycle Transportation Plan which sets forth State highways, which are to be modified to accommodate bicycles and the Plan includes the existing Pine River Recreational Trail which connects communities in Southern Wisconsin to the Spring Green area and, eventually, to Richland Center, and

WHEREAS the Highway and Transportation Committee is recommending that the County Board request the DOT to modify the Wisconsin Bicycle Transportation Plan and the accompanying maps to include all of State Trunk Highway #80 from Richland Center North to Vernon County and, eventually, to Hillsboro, and

WHEREAS making these changes in the Wisconsin Bicycle Transportation Plan would allow for future roadway enhancements in order to connect the 400 Trail and the Pine River Recreational Trail.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Richland County Board of Supervisors that the Wisconsin Department of Transportation is hereby urged to amend the Wisconsin Bicycle Transportation Plan and the accompanying maps to include all of State Trunk Highway 80 from Richland Center North to Vernon County and, eventually, to Hillsboro, and

A Resolution Urging The Legislature To Return To The Former Block Grant Method For County Veterans Service Offices.

WHEREAS, prior to the enactment of the 2015-2017 State biennial budget, which is known as 2015 Act 55, State Veterans Service Office grants to counties were block grants ranging from \$8,500 to \$13,000 based on the county's population and these grants were to be used strictly for supplementing the salary of the County Veterans Service Officer, and

WHEREAS, as a result of the enactment of 2015 Wisconsin Act 55, County Veterans Service Office grants were transitioned to a reimbursement program whereby counties must submit expenses and receive reimbursement for items that are specified as being eligible for State reimbursement and this system is cumbersome and no longer allows Veterans Service Office salary supplementation and it also contains complicated rules of cost eligibility which create financial constraints on counties, and

WHEREAS the Veterans Service Commission has carefully considered this matter and is now presenting this Resolution to the County Board for its consideration.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Richland County Board of Supervisors that the County Board hereby urges the Legislature to repeal the County Veterans Service Officer grants system contained in 2015 Wisconsin Act 55 and return the County Veterans Service Officer grant program to its former status as a block grant program of grants based on county population to be used for supplementing the salary of County Veterans Service Officers, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Clerk is directed to send a copy of this Resolution to Governor Scott Walker, to the Secretary of the Wisconsin Department of Veterans Affairs, to all State Legislators whose districts include any portion of Richland County, to the President of the Wisconsin Veterans Service Officer Association and to the Wisconsin Counties Association, and

WHEREAS, since the estimated cost of each project is between \$5,000 and \$25,000, Wisconsin Statutes, section 59.52 (29) (a) requires that bids be solicited for each project by a one-week advertisement in The Richland Observer and, after that, the work “shall be let as the board may direct”, and

WHEREAS Rule 19 of the Board requires County Board approval for any public improvement project on County-owned real estate, and

WHEREAS the UW-Richland Committee has carefully considered these proposed projects and is now presenting this Resolution to the County Board for its consideration.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Richland County Board of Supervisors that approval is hereby granted for undertaking the following 2 construction projects on the UW-Richland campus:

1. Reconstruction of 4 areas of the Campus parking lot by removing damaged asphalt and replacing it with new asphalt and the County Highway Department is to do this work at a cost not to exceed \$6,700;
2. Replacement of the drains in the kitchen area of the Wallace Student Center, including repairs to the floor and replacement of floor tile and the low bid of Schneider Plumbing and Heating, Inc. of Richland Center in the amount of \$9,540 is accepted and the contract for this work is hereby awarded to that firm, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Funding for these projects shall either be by a separate appropriation presented to the County Board by the Finance and Personnel Committee or, as to project #1, from the UW-Richland Outlay Budget and, as to project # 2, from the Campus Meals Service Fund, and

Ordinance No. 16-14 Amending Ordinance No. 88-7 Entitled “The Public Health Ordinance Of Richland County, Wisconsin” was read by County Clerk Vlasak. Motion by Peters, second by Brewer that Ordinance No. 16-14 be enacted. Health and Human Services Director Patrick Metz answered questions. Motion carried and ordinance declared enacted.

ORDINANCE NO. 16 - 14

An Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 88-7 Entitled “The Public Health Ordinance Of Richland County, Wisconsin”.

The Richland County Board of Supervisors does hereby ordain as follows:

1. That Ordinance No. 88-7 relating to abating human health hazards which affect the public health, as amended to date, is hereby further amended by repealing the following crossed-out language and adopting the following underlined language:

(a) 3. DESIGNATION OF LOCAL HEALTH OFFICER. The ~~Health, Aging and Disability Health Resource Center Manager~~ Public Health Unit Manager, including his or her designee, is hereby designated the “local health officer” as that term is used in section 251.06, Wisconsin Statutes, for Richland County.

(b) Subsection (b) of section 5 entitled “ENFORCEMENT” 6 (b) is amended as follows:

When the order for abatement has not been complied with, such non-compliance shall be reported to the ~~District Attorney-Corporation Counsel~~ of Richland County, which officer is hereby delegated the duty of prosecuting violations of this Ordinance. The ~~District Attorney-Corporation Counsel~~ shall, when that officer deems it appropriate, take steps to enforce this Ordinance and the order for abatement and to abate the hazard and to enjoin the future continuation of the hazard.

2. “local health officer” is substituted for “Aging and Disability Resource Center Manager” in sections (a) and (b) of section 5 entitled “ENFORCEMENT” and in section 6 (a) under the heading “ENFORCEMENT PROCEDURE” .

3. Section 7 entitled “PENALTIES” is amended by substituting “Department of Health Services” for “Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations” and by substituting “section 254.59 (2), Wisconsin Statutes”, for “section 146.14 (2), Wisconsin Statutes”.

4. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its passage and publication.

Ordinance No. 16-15 Amending Ordinance No. 2002-11 Relating To Regulating Assemblies of Large Numbers Of Persons In Richland County was read by County Clerk Vlasak. Motion by Brewer, second by Williamson that Ordinance No. 16-15 be enacted. The proposed ordinance states that section I c of Ordinance No. 2002-11 relating to regulating assemblies of large numbers of persons in Richland County is hereby amended by adding the following underlined words: “This Ordinance shall be effective only in the unincorporated areas of Richland County, except the County Fairgrounds.” Corporation Counsel Southwick explained that the purpose of this ordinance is to except the fairgrounds from the Ordinance No. 2002-11 regulating assemblies of large numbers of persons in Richland County. Questions were raised about the need to split the fairgrounds from the original ordinance. Discussion followed. Motion by Clary, second by Severson to table the ordinance. Motion carried.

Ordinance No. 16-16 Relating To Assemblies Of Large Numbers Of People At The Richland County Fairgrounds was presented to the Board. Motion by Severson, second by Peters that Ordinance No. 16-16 be enacted. Questions were raised about the enactment of an ordinance that is less restrictive than the original ordinance regulating assemblies of large numbers of persons. Motion by Myers, second by Seep to amend section IV c of the proposed ordinance by adding “The Law Enforcement and Judiciary Committee may waive any fencing requirement set forth in this Ordinance”. Motion carried on the amendment. Discussion continued on the proposed ordinance, as amended. Chairman Kirkpatrick noted that the proposed ordinance mirrors the ordinance relating to assemblies of large numbers of people. Discussion continued on the ordinance, as amended. Motion by Williamson, second by Sebranek to postpone action on Ordinance No. 16-16 until the June County Board session. Motion carried.

Motion by Brewer, second by Huffman to postpone action on Ordinance No. 16-15 until the June County Board session. Motion carried.

Resolution No. 16-75 Concerning The Position Of Legal Assistant In The District Attorney’s Office was read by County Clerk Vlasak. Motion by Bellman, second by Clary that Resolution No. 16-75 be adopted. Discussion followed. Motion carried and resolution declared adopted.
