- Cavies, Gerbils, Hamsters and other small pets will be shown at the Small Pet Show on the split fair date.
- Cages will be provided by exhibitor. Exhibitor must be present when judging takes place.
- Exhibitor must have a short write-up explaining what is involved in caring for this animal attached to each cage.
- All animals will be checked for general health.
- Only one (1) item per entry

## **DIVISION J - JUNIOR**

### **Department 111 – Domesticated Exotic Animals – Llamas & Alpacas**

- Domestic Exotic Animals include: Llamas and Alpacas.
- Exhibitors should only enter two premium classes per exhibitor of a single animal and no more than one premium in the following classes – Showmanship and Performance of the Llama or Alpaca. According to ACTP 160.61.
- Llamas and Alpacas from within Wisconsin do not have official ID requirements. Llamas, alpacas from outside Wisconsin must have a certificate of veterinary inspection and official animal health records.
- No mature adult male species of any kind. Only fixed adult male animals will be allowed.
- Only one animal per entry.
- Participant must own Llama shown or have worked with the leased animal during the year.
- Badly behaved and not properly attended animals will be sent home.
- Exhibitor must take care of barn duties and make sure animals have clean pens and animals properly cared for the duration of the fair.
- Showmanship entrants may enter only one class.
- Premise ID required on online entry forms.
