ALL ANIMALS MUST HAVE AN ACCEPTED I.D. NUMBER
(840 RFID Tag Required)

Please see Animal Health Rules and Regulations in the front of the book.

Please note that this year's Swine Show will NOT be terminal.

- **ALL swine must have an 840 RFID tag.** Tags can be purchased at the Extension Office
- **Swine are to be in place by 2 p.m. on Wednesday** of the fair.
- Pigs should be washed before coming to the fair.
- Swine must have a **PRRS and PEDv test within 90 days of exhibition.**
- No positive test or herd plan will be accepted.
- Premises ID number is required.
- **Vet Check-in Sheet.** You must have the sheets properly filled out when bringing your animals, along with ID numbers and vet inspection certificate and/or test papers. All vet check-in sheets **MUST** be filled out and given to the Department Superintendent. Those who **DO NOT** have their sheets filled out will not be checked in and will be asked to leave. The vet check is in the barns **at 5 p.m.** Animals must **be in place and paperwork filled out completely prior to 5 p.m.**
- **Swine Show** to start at **8 a.m.** on the Friday of the fair.

SWINE – CLASSES

JUNIOR YEARLING SOW - born between January 1 - June 30 of year preceding exhibit year.

SENIOR SOW - born between July 1-December 31 of year preceding exhibit year.

SENIOR SPRING BOAR OR GILT - born between January 1 thru February of exhibit year. A local fair may subdivide this entry class into January-born and February- born sows or boars.

JUNIOR SPRING BOAR OR GILT - born during the month of March of exhibit year.

Open Judging follows Junior Judging. LIMIT: 2 entries per sub-entry

SAWDUST: The Richland County Fair Committee has ruled that a **SAWDUST BASE OF 4"** will be allowed in the barns. Woods shavings or shredded paper will be allowed but not bark.

CLASS - BREEDING SWINE

LIMIT: 2 PER SUB-ENTRY

Market pigs will be dividing into weight classes. Minimum weight 220 pounds.

ALL ANIMALS MUST HAVE AN ACCEPTED I.D. NUMBER
(Scrapie Tag / USDA 840 Tag / Legible Scrapie Tattoo)

Please see Animal Health Rules and Regulations in the front of the book.

No more than 2 inches of wool will be allowed on wool sheep breeds and one-inch maximum wool length on all other breeds of sheep.

- **All Sheep will be entered on Wednesday of the fair, by 4 p.m.**
- All animals must have an accepted I.D. number – Scrapie Tag, USDA 840 Tag, or **Legible** Scrapie Tattoo.
- Premises ID number is required.
- **Vet Check-In Sheet.** You must have the sheets properly filled out when you bring your animals, along with ID numbers and vet inspection certificate and/or test papers. All vet check-in sheets **MUST** be filled out and given to the Department Superintendent. Those who **DO NOT** have their sheets filled out will not be checked in and will be asked to leave. The vet check is in the barns **at 5 p.m.** Animals **must be in place and paperwork filled out completely prior to 5 p.m.**
- **** Open & Junior Class exhibitors are responsible for taking down and storing pens they were assigned. Failure to do so will result in forfeiture of Department premiums. ****

SHEEP - CLASSES

JANUARY LAMB - born in January of exhibit year

FEBRUARY LAMB - born in February of exhibit year

MARCH LAMB - born in March of exhibit year

FALL LAMB - born between September 1 - December 31 of year preceding exhibit year

YEARLING RAM OR EWE - born outside the date of birth limitations in 1-4 listed above. The age of yearlings may be subject to verification by a veterinarians' examination whose findings shall be final. A yearling must have two permanent teeth, but cannot have four permanent teeth. The animal will be disqualified if not within this rule. This rule will hold for both open and junior division.

MARKET LAMB - born after January 1 of exhibit year

EXHIBITOR'S FLOCK - shall consist of one yearling or ram lamb, 2 yearling ewes and 2 ewe lambs which are owned by the exhibitor.

**Goats, both Dairy and Meat, are to be brought on
Wednesday as all goats will be shown and judged on
Thursday following the Sheep Show scheduled at 10 a.m.**

- **All Goats will be entered on Wednesday of the fair by 4 p.m.**
- All animals must have an accepted I.D. number – Scrapie Tag, USDA 840 Tag, or Legible Scrapie Tattoo; no chain tags allowed.
- Premises ID number is required.
- **Vet Check-In Sheet.** You must have the sheets properly filled out when bringing in your animals, along with ID numbers and vet inspection certificate and/or test papers. All vet check-in sheets **MUST** be filled out and give to the Department Superintendent. Those who **DO NOT** have their sheets filled out will not be checked in and will be asked to leave. The vet check is in the barns **at 5 p.m.** Animals **must be in place and paperwork filled out completely prior to 5 p.m.**

SAWDUST: The Richland County Fair Committee has ruled that a **SAWDUST BASE OF 4"** will be allowed in the barns.

Woods shavings or shredded paper will be allowed but not bark.

Does under 24 months of age that have never freshened may compete only with junior age classification. Does 24 months of age or over that have never freshened may not be shown. Does that have freshened including dry milkers may compete only in the senior age division. Age shall be determined as of the opening date of the fair. A goat with full natural horns may not be entered unless full natural horns are a standard for a specific breed. **FEMALES ONLY SHALL BE SHOWN.**

Milker – Dry, currently not lactating or completed 210 days+ in current lactation
Milker – Junior, over 2 years and under 3 years of age
Milker – Mature, over 3 years old
Milker – Yearling, under 2 years of age and in milk
Mother & Daughter – 1 doe any age and its dam, animals need not be owned by same exhibitor
Yearling – Junior, 7-12 months old
Yearling – Senior, 12-24 months old

Exhibitor Herd, one doe under 1 year, 1 yearling doe, 1 doe 2 years+, all owned by same exhibitor
Kid – Junior, under 4 months
Kid – Senior, at least 4 months but less than 7 months
Mature Doe
Mother & Daughter – 1 doe, any age, and its dam, animals need not be owned by same exhibitor
Yearling – Junior, 7-12 months
Yearling – Senior, 12-24 months
