- **All Poultry and Pigeons will be entered on Wednesday of the fair by 4 p.m.**
- **ALL EXHIBITORS:** Please submit a copy of the health certificate for Pullorum-Typhoid Clean test with your entry form. Exhibitors are responsible for the test.
- **Numbered leg bands will be required on all poultry and pigeons (exhibitor's responsibility).**
- **Premise ID number** is required.
- When transporting animals into the fair, all cages **MUST** be clean. Any questionable cages will be addressed at time of **check-in** and exhibit will be dismissed from the fairgrounds. There will be no additional check-in times and entry fee paid will not be reimbursed, so be sure to clean cages ahead of time.
- **Vet Check-In Sheet.** You must have the sheets properly filled out when bringing your animals, along with ID numbers and vet inspection certificate and/or test papers. All vet check-in sheets **MUST** be filled out and given to the Department Superintendent. Those who DO NOT have their sheets filled out will not be checked in and will be asked to leave. The vet check is in the barns **at 5 p.m.** Animals **must be in place and paperwork filled out completely prior to 5 p.m.**
- Breeds must be recognized breeds for the class and will be judged according to the American Poultry Association, except for the Any Other Standard Breed NON-Recognized or Crossbred classes. To check your chicken breed – go to the following website at <https://amerpoultryassn.com/accepted-breeds-varieties/>. Does not include Pigeon breeds: **NOTE:** Pigeons – Performing or sporting breeds are: Rollers, Tiplers, Tumblers, Homers, etc. Utility breeds are: Mondains, Kings, Carneaus, etc. Fancy Breeds are: Fantails, Pouters, Frills, Modenas, etc.

(Ear Tattoo – No Permanent Markers)**

- **All Rabbits will be entered on Wednesday of the fair by 4 p.m.**
- **All rabbits must be tattooed** with an identification number. Rabbits with tattoos written in the ear with a permanent marker **WILL NOT be accepted**. If any rabbits need to be tattooed before the fair, call Cindi Harris (608-537-2059) in advance). **Exhibitors may not show more than THREE breeds**. Judging will be face to face on Friday after the Junior Division judging is completed.
- **Vet Check-In Sheet.** You must have the sheets properly filled out when bringing in your animals along with ID numbers and vet inspection certificate and/or test papers. All vet check-in sheets **MUST** be filled out and given to the Department Superintendent. Those who DO NOT have their sheets filled out will not be checked in and will be asked to leave. The vet check is in the barns **at 5 p.m.** Animals **must be in place and paperwork filled out completely prior to 5 p.m.**
- **Rabbits** will be checked in by the Fair Superintendents and animals with health concerns will be examined by the fair veterinarian for further consideration.
- **Rabbits showing** evidence of specific disease cannot be exhibited at any fair. If at any time any animal in the group shows evidence of a contagious or infectious disease, it shall be immediately removed from the exhibit or

**DIVISION O – OPEN  
DEPARTMENT 14 – PLANT & SOIL

Open to residents of Richland County. Judged on Friday. All exhibits must have been produced by the exhibitor during the exhibit year. Not more than one entry is allowed by any farm or any one exhibitor. Please follow instructions as to size of sheaves, slabs, etc., as this will be considered in judging.

**GRAINS** – Grain will be judged on uniformity of kernel, soundness, percent of foreign matter, weight per bushel, and percent of damaged grain. One peck to be exhibited in neat, clean containers.

**SHEAF EXHIBITS** – Sheaf exhibits should be securely tied in attractive bundles. Sheaf exhibits of grain should be 2 inches in diameter at middle band and shall be dried throughout. Leaves should be removed from sheaf of small grains. Hay sheaves shall be at least 5 inches in diameter. Samples should be selected when in right stage for good hay, cured throughout leaves left on and as green cured as possible.

**FORAGE** – Display to be a slab approximately 6 inches thick, wrapped neatly in a clear plastic bag. Unwrapped slabs will not be accepted.

- **No rabbits with babies** are permitted.
- **Only rabbits entered** in the fair are permitted on the fairgrounds.
- **Cages, water and feed dishes** will be provided. **Exhibitor must bring feed and is responsible for daily care for their animals. Failure to provide adequate daily care will result in dismissal.**
- **When transporting animals into the fair**, all cages **MUST** be clean. Any questionable cages will be addressed at time of check-in and exhibit will be dismissed from the fairgrounds. There will be no additional check-in times and entry fee paid will not be reimbursed, so be sure to clean cages ahead of time.

**CLASS – MARKET – MEAT RABBITS**

**Premiums: 1<sup>st</sup> - \$2.00; 2<sup>nd</sup> - \$1.75; 3<sup>rd</sup> - \$1.50; 4<sup>th</sup> - \$1.25**

**ENTRY**

**Meat Pen** – consist of 3 rabbits. All rabbits shall be of the same breed and variety (not necessarily purebreds). No rabbit may be over 10 weeks of age and 3.5 to 5.5 pounds. These rabbits may not be entered in any other classes.

**Roaster Rabbit** – single rabbit, either sex, must be under 6 months of age and 5.5 to 9 pounds in weight, may not be entered in any other classes.

**Single Fryer** – not over 10 weeks of age and 3.5 to 5.5 pounds, may not be entered in any other classes.
