Milk donors are healthy, lactating women who have extra milk and want to help other babies who are in need. It is expected for donors to:

- Donate at least 100 ounces at your first drop-off
 - o There is no minimum for future donations, every drop is appreciated!
- Follow the milk donation guidelines set by the Mothers' Milk Bank of the Western Great Lakes.
- Maintain contact with the Milk Bank to report medications and household illnesses.
- Drop off milk at a convenient Milk Depot, or work with us to arrange for shipping.
- Keep milk frozen at home and during transport.
