- 1. Call to Order: Committee Chair Severson called the meeting to order at 5:04 p.m.
- 2. Proof of Notification: Chair Severson verified that the meeting had been properly noticed.
- **3. 8B Fair-Taken out of order.** Dr. Christine, Fair Vet, spoke regarding the Avian Flu and possible changes to the 2022 Fair. Wallace and Imhoff spoke on being in support of doing what would be needed if the situation changes.
- 4. Elect Vice Chari and Secretary.

 - i. Nomination for Vice Chair. Motion by Campbell to nominate Gald, second by Deaver. Nomination accepted by Gald. Collins closes nominations with unanimous ballot for Gald, second by Siemandel. All voting aye, motion carried.
 - b. Nomination for Secretary. Motion by Collins to nominate Chicker, second by Supervisor Gottschall. Nomination accepted by Chicker. Supervisor Rudersdorf closes nominations with unanimous ballot for Chicker. All voting aye, motion carried.
- 5. Election of Representative for Rules & Strategic Planning. Chair Severson stated the representative from Fair, Recycling and Parks Standing Committee would be need to Supervisor Rudersdorf with the new organization. Motion by Chicker that Supervisor Rudersdorf be appointed per request from Administrator Langreck, second by Gald. All voting aye, motion carried.

- 8. A- Fair. Permission request for placement of Concrete Slab by Jason Kleppe. Kleppe is asking for approval to place a donated 30 x10 concrete slab for a scale that will be used during his event in July. Doudna showed a picture of the area that Kleppe marked off. Motion by Gald to approve the donated slab, second by Siemandel. Discussion by Collins that pictures be taken of the process and that Kleppe work with the office in having Marshall scheduled to

Proposed Policy to encourage Richland County Departmental support of staffing needs at the Richland County Fair

**DRAFT-needs work before going to Clint

The purpose of this policy is to establish appropriate guidelines granting Richland County employees the opportunity to support the Richland County Fair through in worked hours or volunteer hours. This policy would allow Richland County Staff to volunteer their time or work their regularly scheduled shift at the fair as assigned by the Fair Coordinator.

The policy shall provide as follows:

- An employee willing to work at the Richland County Fair must first receive prior approval from their Department Head for the department in which they are currently employed. The Department Head reserves the right to grant or decline such request(s) based on current department needs.
- 2. An employee who is granted approval to work at the Richland County Fair will receive their regular rate of pay from the department they work within and only for the hours they were approved to work.
- An employee may work during their regularly scheduled shift or hours within that business day, at regular pay with no overtime. They may also utilize flextime, vacation time or comp time to work hours outside of their regularly scheduled business hours. This needs to be reworded
- 4. No overtime is to be incurred by the employee working at the Richland County Fair.
- 5. An employee may elect to volunteer at the Richland County Fair without pay. That volunteer time is not subject to department head approval.
- 6. Department Heads reserve the right to revoke approval to work at the Richland County Fair at any time to ensure appropriate staffing within the department.
- 7. The work being done and hours needed will be determined by the Richland County Fair Coordinator.
